Minutes

1. Opening Worship
 - Brother Ben Cheng led the attendees in worship, followed by welcome from Elder Eric Keasberry.
2. Senior Pastor's Address
 - Pastor Kim Lau addressed the meeting from Isaiah 6:1-8, reminding us that our mission comes from God and we need worship in spirit and in truth.
3. Apologies
 - Elder Eric Keasberry opened the meeting, confirming quorum has been reached.
 - Church Secretary has received a list of apologies.
4. Corrigenda and Adoption of Minutes of 2009 AGM, 2010 OGM
 - Elder Eric Keasberry explained the corrigenda published.

5. Receipt of Senior Pastor, Chairman, Congregation and Departmental Reports

6. Video Report (What have we been doing)
 - Sister Shermaine Pan (interpreted by Brother Marcus Luk) presented the video report featuring some of the events that have been happening as a Church.

7. Paris Summer Mission Report

- Brother Matt Coulson (interpreted by Brother Marcus Luk) presented a report of the Paris Summer Mission Report, providing an overview of what happened during the Paris Mission Trip and the activities undertaken.

8. Missionary Report: Melanie Bister

- Sister Melanie Bister is one of the missionaries supported by the Church. She shared her experience as a Missionary in Tai Wan in the last 4 years and give thanks to the Lord for the support she has had.
- Melanie gave thanks for God's answers to her prayers and in His provision – in 2006, there was 1 missionary and currently there are 23.
- Melanie explained whilst there has been missionaries working in Tai Wan for a long time, there is only a very small percentage of Christian. Tai Wan is a place that still needs a lot of our prayers and work.
- Going ahead, when Melanie's home assignment finishes next June, she is hoping to return to Tai Wan to continue her work. She asked for support in prayers from the Church.

9. Financial Report and Presentation of 2009-2010 Accounts

- Brother Chi Kin Ho (interpreted by Brother Marcus Luk) explained the financial report for the Church in the absence of Brother Roger Yung.
- Sister Virginia Au explained on page 12 of the Financial Report (Detailed Statement of Financial Activities), there is a negative figure of £1,210 for expenditure under Building fund project. The reason for this is that in the previous year, we have made provision for English Heritage to claw back some of the grants. At the end, English Heritage has clawed back less than expected. Therefore, there is over provision in the amount allocated.

11. Presentation of 2010-2011 Budget

- Brother Chi Kin Ho presented the 2010-2011 budget, highlighting key areas including new additions.
- Sister Ai-Hua Breckon asked if provision has been made for the employment of an administrator. Chi Kin confirmed this has been included.
- Sister Ai-Hua suggested that there should be 2 people counting the offering every Sunday due to the amount of monies being handled. Chi Kin confirmed this is already in practice in Cantonese and Mandarin services. Offering for Cable Street services is sealed and brought back to Cantonese service for counting. Roger is currently working with English congregation in order to provide some assistance to Brother Michael Poon who currently has sole responsibility for the offering.

- Brother Him Shun Yip asked what is included under “Staff Expenses”. Brother Chi Kin Ho explained that it entails travel expenses, telephone costs and also any other expenses solely relating to the purpose of the work for the Church.
- Sister Evon Chung reminded the Church that the amount included in staff expenses is higher than previous year due to the fact that we are anticipating increasing the number of staff we will be employing.

Kim Ho: What is the current progress regarding the application for funds for Cable Street?

Matthew Coulson: Application has been submitted and we are currently awaiting response.

Pui Ka Yip: When is the problem caused by the painting of the exterior on Cable Street going to be fixed?

Chi Kin Ho: It is still being worked on between our architect, the publicity company and our solicitors. The contractor has admitted liability and it is going to take time to get it resolved. Those concerned will take it as a learning opportunity. Whilst we may have made a mistake in hindsight even though the intention was good, we will continue to look for ways to raise funds for the Cable Street project.

Elder Eric Keasberry commented that the plan for the Cable Street fundraising project has not changed. We are still aiming for this to be completed in time for us to use the Cable Street building in full for the 50th anniversary. As Pastor Kim shared before, it is not as unachievable as it appears. In the next 3 years, if we have 100 members contributing £1000 each for the next 3 years, this goal is achievable.

Brother Chi Kin Ho mentioned that the Church will be purchasing a new minibus by the end of this year. This is due to the age of the current one and the problems we have been having.

Koon Ming Leung: Where is the new minibus going to be parked?

Elder Eric Keasberry:We are not sure as yet. The current minibus is parked at Pastor Douglas Sadler's house as the main driver for MC lives in Stockport. For convenience, it is easier for him to collect the minibus there. This will be reviewed when we buy the new minibus.

Michael Poon: Another reason for the minibus to be parked outside Pastor Douglas Sadler's house is that he takes responsibility for all the maintenance of the minibus. This is something we need to consider when looking into where the new minibus is to be parked.

Minutes

1. Worship (Evon Chung)

- Worship started at 12:10 led by Evon Chung

2. Opening and Welcome (Elder Eric Keasberry)

- Interpreted by Brother Ben Cheng
- Elder Eric Keasberry opened the meeting and thanked Elder PK Cheung for his faithful service.

3. Cable Street Update (Roger Yung)

- Roger gave an update for the progress with where we are up to.
- To let us get to where we need to be, we need to be aiming for £100 per month per working family.
- We currently have £165,000.00 in cash in our bank account (as at end of May). With the end of the financial year in October. If we raise another £25,000.00 in the next few months, we should meet our target of raising £190,000.00. If we raise another £100,000 next year, we will then be on track to start building work next year.
- Roger encourages brothers and sisters to continue to contribute generously as we will get there and it is possible to start building!

4. Introduction re Elder Election (Pastor Kim Lau)

- Interpreted by Brother Ben Cheng
- Pastor Kim Lau explained the role of the Elders within MCCC. Whilst the Elders do not get involved with the day to day leadership, their role is very important as they are the custodian of faith for the whole Church.

- This is the reason why we must all consider carefully and we must all take part; as in essence we are handing over our own spiritual authority to our Elders.
- We must only vote for those who we believe has been personally called by God to serve in this capacity.
- Profiles of the 2 Eldership candidates were displayed.
- Pastor Kim Lau explained the procedure for the Eldership approval.

5. Prayer (Pastor Kenneth Kwok)

- Pastor Kenneth Kwok led us in prayer.

6. Reappointment of Elder Eric Keasberry (Pastor Kim Lau)

- Voting casted by secret ballot, collected by Church Secretary
- Counted by Pastor Kenneth Kwok, Assistant Minister Gary Wong and Brother Lin Bin

7. Appointment of James Lay as Elder (Pastor Kim Lau)

8. The Big Mission (Pastor Kim Lau)

- Interpreted by Brother Ben Cheng
- Pastor Kim Lau explained our plan for Big Mission this year
- Highlighted the signatures event in Nov which included the short term mission team with Restaurant Evangelism Fellowship outreaching in Manchester and North Wales, Chinese Opera, Marriage Enrichment Conference and Student Concert & Firework Parties.
- The aim of these events is to cover audience of a large age range.
- The Big Mission has been happening since January, not just the November mission. The events included CNY celebration, Sports Weekend, Evangelistic Concert...
- On average, 30% of attendance were non-Christians, reaching mainly the 25-35 demographic within the hundreds that have attended.
- Other outreach events planned have been outlined.
- Most important idea is supporting the Big Mission 2011 is locally based visitation. Locally based in terms of where we live and fellowship. The idea is to make friends and form personal relationships.
- New approach to adopt across all congregations – spider-web visitation.
- 2nd important idea: We want to raise the non Christian attendance at our outreach events from 30% to 33%.
- 3rd important idea: Meeting people's needs within the community – establishing an advice centre in Cable Street.

- 4th important idea: Go where the people are – expanding the Gambling Rehabilitation Ministry into the casinos.
- Finally, everyone in the Church is included. We need prayer to mobilise the Church.
- Specific appeals for November mission: Drivers with satnavs, People ready to visit new addresses as well as old friends.

9. Sharing (Elder Eric Keasberry)

- Interpreted by Pastor Kenneth Kwok
- **Josephia Lau:** The Church is much cleaner nowadays. I would therefore like to thank Brother Tsang Po Tam on behalf of the Church for his hard work. I would also like to thank Mrs Ng for her faithful visits to the sick and elderly. Also Brother Koon Ming for his faithful service within the Sunday School; Gary Wong & Sandy for their work within the hospital visitations.
- **Koon Ming Leung:** I would like to share the work within the Chinese School. 3 years ago, we started Mandarin teaching in Chinese class with one teacher. Last year, we had 2. Now that we are planning to start a new school year, we will have 6 brothers and sisters from the Mandarin congregation. With the increase in teachers, we can now have 2 classes starting this coming year. Thank you for the brothers and sisters who have committed to work in this ministry; and for our God who provides. Also like to encourage brothers and sisters to continue to join in.
- **Assistant Minister Yuping Qin:** I really would like to thank Brother Matt Coulson together with Jason, Anna for their work within the youth in the Mandarin congregation. For their hard work and faithful service. Their work attracted lots of youth and parents coming to Mandarin congregation. Thank Pastor Kim for the vision for unity of the Church so that we can support each other in service. I would also like to thank Brother Lin Bin and his wife. They specifically drive 2 cars every week so they can take another family who live nearby to Church every week. There are also other brothers and sisters like Wenzhong's family who opened up their house for a large Bible study group, within which there are over 50 families in their spider web.
- **Amy So:** I would like to thank God and MCCC for having the vision to outreach in North Wales. Even though we have our own meetings, our leaders do not have very mature spiritual lives. We therefore would like to thank God & MCCC for sending Assistant Minister Gary Wong and Sandy to help us. We know it is a long term spiritual battle. I therefore like to ask brothers and sisters to pray for the mission work in North Wales and for the work of extending the kingdom of God and be a good steward. I would like to thank the pastoral team of MCCC and particularly sister Sandy who came to us every 2 weeks to teach us. May all glory and honour be given to our Lord Jesus Christ.
- **Elder PK Cheung:** My last day at the HMRC will be 10 August. My plan after that is to go back to HK for 2 months (even though Mrs Cheung wants 3!). We will probably leave for HK in September / October. I should still be in MCCC for at least 18-24 months (God willing, maybe longer). I will still be preaching in Cantonese congregation. I would also like to thank all brothers and sisters who have been supporting me and my family in my ministry in the last 30+ years. May God bless you all.

Council Chairman's Report

Do What You're Called to Do!

We love to quote the promise, *'I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me'* (Philippians 4:13 NKJV). But that promise doesn't mean you can do whatever you want, or what somebody else does. No, Paul is saying you can do anything God calls you to do, for with each of His assignments comes His assistance. This verse actually teaches you to stay within the boundaries of what God's called you to do, and not try to undertake things that are not part of His will for you. That's not negativism, it's wisdom. God wants you looking to Him for your answers, not others. That doesn't mean you can't learn from others, it just means the plan that will lead you to success must come from God. What is God's will for your life? Find it, do it, otherwise you'll live in frustration, competing and comparing yourself with others. John the Baptist said, 'A man must be content to receive the gift which is given him from heaven.' Read the previous verses and you'll discover that some of John's disciples were getting upset because Jesus was baptising too, and the crowds were leaving John and flocking to Him. If John hadn't been secure in his God-given identity and calling, he might have become fearful and jealous. But he displayed a different attitude - one you need to take to heart. He said, '[I] can receive nothing [he can claim nothing, he can take unto himself nothing] except as it has been granted to him from heaven. [A man must be content to receive the gift which is given him from heaven...]' (John 3:27-29). And the same goes for you!

I hope this reading taken from UCB's daily reading will remind and help us in our service and walk with the Lord Jesus at MCCC. God has called each one of us to do His will in His Church. We need to know what His will is for our lives and just simply do it. Remember that His will for us extends also to how we live and conduct ourselves in our places of study and work!

As our Church grows, the need for more workers becomes more evident and urgent. We thank God for the four full time staff that we have supported by many brothers and sisters who are willing to serve often in spite of their very busy professions. We will soon be appointing a new youth worker and we must continue to pray that the Lord will soon provide a Pastor for our Mandarin work. Over the past few years, we have become more and more burdened with the administrative work of the Church. We now have a Church office at Cable Street. But the senior leaders of the Church have long felt the need for a full/part time administrator. The administrative burden will increase with increasing number of staff as we will have to comply with Employment law and requirements of Health and Safety and Charity law. Please pray that God will provide a suitable person for the post of administrator.

At the request of the Church Council, the Administration Department recently carried out a salary review for our staff. As a result a new Salary structure has been agreed. Please give your support by your approval of the Budget for next year.

We are so grateful for the long and faithful ministry of Elder P K Cheung who has recently stepped down. We wish him a very happy and long retirement from his tax inspector profession. We know that the Lord will continue to honour his ministry in other capacities within the Church. We are also thankful to the Lord for the recent

appointment of Elder James Lay. We pray that God will bless his ministry especially within the Cantonese Congregation. We will soon be appointing another Elder to serve in the English Congregation.

We thank the Lord for sister Evon Chung and brother Roger Yung for their faithful service as Church Secretary and Treasurer respectively. As they will be stepping down, let us pray that God will provide their successors of His choice.

Finally, I will conclude by referring to the Cable Street project. I believe we are on target to raise about £400,000 for the next phase which will allow us to start the building work in 2014. Please continue to pray and support the building fund. May the Lord bless you richly!

Senior Pastor's Report

As I write, the climax of our Big Mission project is underway with a team of over 40 people from various parts of the world in Manchester helping us to sow the seed and grow relationships in our Chinese community. Geographically we are stretching out "locally" in North Wales and in Bolton. But geographical spread is only one part of the story, we are also digging deep into the community moving into the casinos and restaurants – the places where our people work and play asking them questions getting to know them and their hopes and aspirations, finding out how we can help them in their lives. Alongside this we have started our MCCC Advice Centre providing help in the place where people really need it. One Elder's wife, commenting on Luke 7:22, said, "Who are blind but those cannot read English? Who are dumb but those who cannot speak in English? Who are deaf but those who cannot understand English? Who are lame but those who do not know how to use the buses and trains?" And we can extend her thought by asking, "Who are lepers but those who are cursed by the disease of gambling? Who are the dead but those who do not know Christ?" We are doing the work of Christ - and this is thrilling!

But there comes with it a health warning

See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. (Matt. 10:16)

There will be opposition: as more and more we do the work of the Lord so more and more will we be opposed by the Enemy. We have seen and felt this as tensions and conflict have afflicted different ministries within the church; key people have lost their joy under the pressure of work and ministry; and doubt and sorrow have assailed the leadership. This is only to be expected and we must hold fast and stand firm. Individually and collectively we must *put on the whole armour of God and having done everything, to stand firm quenching all the flaming arrows of the evil one (Eph 6:11ff).*

So we must be *wise* and *innocent as doves* resisting the attacks of the Enemy and, setting aside all enmity and strife, seek to love one another in truth supporting each other through prayer and grace.

We are growing. We see this formally in the number of baptisms we perform each year (roughly 8%), financially in the continuing increase in income in difficult economic times, and every week in the numbers of people who want to join us in our congregations. A rough and ready estimate easily shows that we have at least 450 people of all ages attending church on a Sunday. This is the Lord's blessing as we serve Him in the work of the Kingdom. But this growth brings with it further challenges. Our administrative and leadership structures are creaking under the strain and urgently need strengthening and reshaping to cope with the expansion. Our staff team is far too small and so there will be a significant expansion of the staff team in this coming year to cope with and nurture the growth we are experiencing. If we hope to see our numbers grow well beyond their present size this is a necessary and urgent development.

Which also means that we need to review how we work as a church. This review is underway and it is a radical review looking at *every* aspect of church. The outcome is unclear at the moment and will not become clear until well

into 2012 but will almost certainly bring with it major changes in the way we do church and many may feel uncomfortable when the changes begin to be implemented round about 2013 but unless we endure the pain of pruning and change we will not continue to be fruitful.

The church of God is not a beautiful statue, immutable and frozen in time, it is a living, growing organism, and as it grows it changes. If it grows in the way that God desires then it will be beautiful, if it grows differently it becomes grotesque and ugly, if it ceases to grow and change it is dead.

Administration Department Report 2011

The Administration Department consists of the following brothers and sisters: Elder Eric, Pastor Kim, Kenny, Evon, Roger, Jonathan and Mr Tsang Po Tam.

The department had been focusing on several items in the past year. One of the main focal points had been the employment of a pastor for the Mandarin Congregation. Although we had already spent plenty of time looking into this matter, getting an employer sponsor license from the Home Office seems to be the major stumbling block. One of the things we have to do is to ensure our Church complies with what the Home Office deems to be good human resources practices. As a result, we need to ensure a robust and fully auditable human resources system is put in place in order for us to make a successful application. The administration department is working on it. May God continue to give us wisdom on this matter.

In terms of Cable Street Project, our target is to start the next phase of building work by 2013. Although the building fund is still below target, we are hopeful that we will have sufficient fund to commence the work as scheduled. We thank all brothers and sisters for their offering and prayer to the project. May God continue to give us vision to offer abundantly so that The Cable Street Building will be ready for commissioning in 2016 for our 50th anniversary.

A new minibus was purchased at the beginning of 2011 and for the meantime the old minibus is still running. We now have two minibuses which serve the three congregations. A system was set up to keep all relevant driver information to ensure that all drivers of the new minibus were competent to drive it. Although there is restriction as to who can drive the minibus, we currently have sufficient brothers and sisters who are licences to do so. May God continue to keep and protect us.

The church centre underwent some internal refurbishment in September. There was a team of brothers and sisters contributing to the design of the refurbishment. Our general duty co-ordinator of the English Congregation was working hard to find and liaise with the builders to make sure the church was functioning as usual at weekends. There will be other items which needs attending to. The church garden was also maintained by the Cantonese Congregation general duty co-ordinator. Some hedges which were overgrown had been trimmed. May God continue to strengthen us to maintain our beautiful church.

The administration team will also undergo some personnel changes. We will have a new church treasurer for the next year as our current church treasurer is now attending a church in Leeds. We will also need a new church secretary as our current church secretary will be focusing on other ministries and will not be available for reappointment. We are also drawing up a plan for a part time administrator post. May God continue to lead us and to move us to serve Him.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all brothers and sisters in all three congregations for their support and prayer. Serving the Lord as a department coordinator is a big challenge for me personally. Neither have I got any good leadership skill, nor a good network of contacts. But, The Holy Spirit inspired me to take up the role to serve. I want to say like King David “I love you, O Lord, my strength.” Psalm 18:1

Mission Department Report

Dear everyone,

Another year another report. As it is towards the end of my term as the head of Mission Department (MD), I will firstly in this report try to look back and work out what most people will call the job description of my post. Secondly, I will give you a brief breakdown of the highs and lows of this year seeing it from my perspective.

The bible, the spiritual sword as Paul puts it in Ephesians (armour of God in chapter 6), is always our source of inspiration. If we turn to 1 Timothy, chapter 3, Paul has laid down the rules, regulations and expectations for an overseer and deacon and it is from this insight that I am going to base my job description, as the head of MD is, in essence, a church deacon.

Deacon means, "one who serves". This position first started in the time of Acts (Acts 6) when the apostles in Jerusalem were burdened with daily administrative tasks and couldn't concentrate on preaching (Greek-speaking Christian widows' needs were overlooked). So clearly deacons are not part of the pastoral team and in modern day terms, a manager of some sort.

From vs 8, a list of must do's are given for any potential future deacons. Words like, "men worthy of respect, sincere, not pursuing dishonest gain" (1 Tim 3:8), are echoing through out. As I am quite well known as a fun loving character, even perceived as not taking things too seriously, I hope brothers and sisters have seen me growing up and taking up the responsibility throughout these last 2 years. One thing was quite clear right from the beginning was that fairness is the only way to gain everyone's respect. Fairness is needed to all three congregations and to all church members. It all boils down to fairness in resource allocation and budget control. How to share the MD's budget cake fairly is another way to put it. With over £6000 worth of money annually, second only to Sunday School's budget for comparison, it has risen from Michael's day (the one and only original head of MD) of roughly £2000. That is a 3x increase. In order to assist in this respect, a robust administrative tool for money distribution was obviously needed and, coming from a medical background, hence the mission grant system was instituted. At first, it did cause some confusion and even unhappiness as, mirroring a successful medical research grant application, a medical or PhD degree of some description was needed to write one. As a result, the form was much simplified and slowly people are starting to accept the form. It is now an integral part of the administrative structure speeding up the discussion in every sleepiness MD meetings. Rejection of applications is at times unavoidable. I was once asked by a potential project applying church member not to worry about the money and budget constraints but just to go ahead with the project in mind. However that is where the theological argument of what is faith in God's provision and what is a good steward of God's provision starts.

The second half of the story of this report is dedicated to the formation of the current strategy of the November Big Mission, ie, "your God needs you". It was conceived from our last mission training day back in March 2011. It was a successful training and consultation day among brothers and sisters. Two themes emerged from many worthy contenders. They are (1) Spider web visitation and (2) social caring. The Spider concept comes from the experience in Bolton fellowship where long term friendship building and follow- up with local resident Chinese are the name of

the game. Social caring on the other hand is a simple concept to care for the Chinese community in this time of austerity. The first project of its kind is the advice centre which, at the time of writing is about to get off the ground. The hope is in not too distant future, the Chinese community in Manchester will be well served by our church and hence the Church will be a magnet of attraction for Chinese of all kind.

Finally, North Wales' mission is now in its stride and Sandy Wong is going to Bangor regularly every fortnight to conduct bible study. This coming November Big Mission also involves a Chinese opera song concert not just in Manchester but also in North Wales.

Bolton University student work is now into the second year and fully alive.

All these projects are fully supported by the mission grants.

Looking into the future, next year we will probably concentrate more on overseas mission and we have already set our sights on Norway.

A new Co-ordinator will be needed in 2012. We need to pray together that the Lord will provide the right person.

The story to be continued.

Children and Youth Department Report

First of all, we want to praise God for his faithfulness in providing sufficient resources for yet another wonderful year in the Children and Youth ministry.

It was a right and wonderful way to show our appreciation to all our brothers and sisters who served in this ministry in 2010-11 with an annual Teachers / Leaders Appreciation Meal on Sunday 3rd April 2011 at the church centre. 35 teachers and leaders, more than half of the team, were able to join in the meal. We thank God for their commitment and their faithfulness in serving in the Children and Youth ministry.

The Mission statement of the Children and Youth Ministry

‘Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it.’ Proverbs 22:6

For many years, the C&Y ministry has ventured into many different areas as we seek to serve our younger generation. This has led to the expansion and development of further direct and indirect ministries. Each of these areas contributed to the different objectives in the Mission Statement.

These are:

- Chinese Class for Outreach (外展)
- Bible Class for Nurture (培育)
- Youth Group for Train up (培訓)

Some directly related ministries developed from within the Children and Youth ministry:

1. Imagine (Dance, Community & Drama) for 9 years from 2001 to 2010 – Built supportive relationship amongst our young people
2. Youth Group Community projects - Building relationship with the local community.
3. Youth Conference NEEC, as conference organiser since 1991 - Building Christian support networks in North England
4. Youth Tuesday Fellowship - Developing young believers and Christian leadership
5. Youth Worship Team - Developing service to the church through music
6. Youth Summer Mission – Experiencing evangelism and application of faith
7. Youth Retreats – Consolidating young people faith

Other indirectly related ministries included working with other Christian organisations:

1. COCM PHAT Camp - Building Christian support networks in South England
2. Summer Camps & Conferences – Worshiping and training with other Non-Chinese Christians

Mandarin Class Development

For the last two years, we thank God for bringing sufficient mandarin teachers to teach the Interest Class for the aged 13 and above. In 2011-12 we are stepping out in faith to start one more class for the aged 5 to 6. It means that we will need to open Class 2 on top of the Class 1 in one or two year time, and then Class 3, Class 4 and so on, until we can open Class 7 for the aged 17 & above as all the lower levels are being established.

Please pray for this work. Pray that we will have enough Mandarin teachers to serve in this ministry. These teachers will mainly come from the Mandarin Congregation. We want to reach out to Mandarin speaking families in Manchester, so that they will choose to send their children to our Mandarin class instead of others.

Mandarin Youth Group

From February 2011, our youth leaders responded to a request from the Mandarin Congregation to start a youth group meeting at Brunswick Church on Sunday. This is quite a small group of about 10 young people aged between 8 to 13 and the response so far has been very positive. This additional work for the youth leader team has been manageable and workable. The aim is to integrate young people from the mandarin congregation into the Sunday school youth group in the future; to achieve this would also depend on the setting up of the full range of mandarin classes.

Tuesday Youth Fellowship

We thank God that Tuesday Youth Fellowship is growing in numbers, around 30 young people attend at some point, and God has also provided a new White minibus to take some of them home afterwards.

Youth NEEC Organising Team

This year, the youth NECCC (formerly called yNEEC) 2011 was co-organised by Liverpool and Manchester. The change of dates of the conference to the beginning of May meant that many had to choose between attending the conference and staying home to revise for exams. This resulted in lower attendance ~70 instead of the usual 100 in previous years. We thank God for those who attended; all were blessed with refreshed spirits. Over 97% had recommitted, rededicated or accepted Christ Jesus, as their saviour and Lord during the conference.

Prayer for Spiritual Growth for those leaving the Youth Group

Many youth members have finished school and left Manchester for their studies while some have chosen to stay and continue to serve in the Youth ministry. Please pray for those who are now living away that they will settle in a church quickly, grow in faith as well as have the boldness to witness for God in their lives and areas of study.

May God continue to uphold our teachers and leaders with wisdom and grace as they serve faithfully to bless all the children and young people in the Children and Youth ministry! May God bless you all!

English Congregation Report

2011 have been an amazing and adventurous journey in all aspects of holistic life for members of the English congregation. Praise God for his graciousness!

Growth, both in terms of numerical growth as well as spiritual growth have marked one of the highlights of our year. This year in particular, we have had a great influx of students from South East Asia and young working professionals. A typical Sunday service is one where latecomers struggle to find a place to sit especially in front of the hall and occasionally, stewards will be seen putting out additional chairs to accommodate the numbers. Praise God! The fellowship shared on a Sunday morning and during fellowship group meetings, encourages accountability amongst one another through ups and downs as well as promotes the expression of love to each other. Family communions during the summer have provided opportunities for people to openly share with each other about their encounters with God in their daily lives.

Feeding on the word of God attenuates our spiritual growth. The balance in life of intimacy with God (UP relationship), intimacy with the family of God (IN relationship) and intimacy with others (OUT relationship) is not one that many of us masters and in fact, struggle in general because we are out of sync and out of balance. We have been focussing on both the 'up' and 'in' aspects in teaching and will be focussing on the 'out' during the coming months.

Worship on a Sunday morning has been a major area of focus for growth – not only for the congregation, but for the worship team to be able to connect and grow with each other. Small one degree shifts have been made and we are far from perfect but on the journey of learning by grace and through grace. Service in either the worship team or as part of the steward teams have unfortunately evolved over the years to being rota-driven. One of the aims of the small step changes is to change the mindset from filling in a rota to passion-driven service in ministry, where people are placed in ministries where they flourished well and their passions are developed further.

The ministry of the gospel is another area in which we have made changes to help create opportunities for our members to bring their friends, colleagues & neighbours to church-related events. The Chinese New Year celebration, HAT trick (football tournament cum BBQ) and the picnic at the park were events organised to build intentional bridges of relationships with people in our frontline as well as opportunistically share the message of salvation. We have learnt, taking the positives and improving from our mistakes and failures through each event. However, evangelism is not about a specific-organised event but a lifestyle which enables the sharing of the message of God's love through our actions, words and deeds, and we are still in the process of learning and relearning.

The year ahead is exciting, for God has amazing things in stored for us as we encounter Him through our life of worship.

Cantonese Congregation Report

*“He God of Israel said,

For this reason, I prefer this translation of v.5 in the *New King James Version*, which is almost unique amongst all the various versions in stressing the inadequacies of David's house ('although my house is not so with God, yet...'), rather than asking a rhetorical question (e.g. *NI, RSV*) or doing away with the comment about it altogether (e.g. *Good News Bible*).

So, as I come to summing up the life of the Cantonese congregation over the past year, I too would like to make it an expression of our gratefulness to our God who has blessed us not out of merit on our part, but out of his unflinching love. *2 Samuel 23:1-7*, the heart of this final section and said to be David's last words as an inspired author, is in the form of a *Psalm*. Why not celebrate God's goodness to us here in the form of a *Psalm* too, a *la Psalm 136*?

Oh, give thanks to the LORD, for He is good!
For His mercy endures forever.

To Him who lets us call on His name and sends us to preach (*Romans 10:14-15*),
For His mercy endures forever.

To Him who has added numbers to his house (13 baptised and 3 transferred),
For His mercy endures forever.

To Him who challenges us to renew our effort in outreach, culminating in the November Mission,
For His mercy endures forever.

Mandarin Congregation Report

Thanks be to God. Over the past year, the Holy Spirit has been at work in MCCC Mandarin Congregation and filled in every part of our mission. We are so excited to see that the Lord's will to rejuvenating our church, providing what we need continuously and sending His loyal servants us, joining in the revitalisation of God's Kingdom. The following is a summary of the major activities and its fruits conducted by MCCC Mandarin service over the past year:

Teaching and Training

The theme of this year's Sunday services has been "to root down deep below and yield fruit above", which is aimed at teaching the congregation to take root in God's Word, the Big Commandment and the Mission of Jesus Christ so as to help their spiritual growth and to yield fruits of submissiveness, happiness and unity in gospel. As a way to support this theme, we have offered a systematic Bible reading plan. We have invited Pastor Deng from the United States to train us on our Bible reading strategies and study courses. In November this year, we plan to jumpstart the first Bible study group in line with Pastor Deng's Bible study system, in November this year, as we believe that this Bible study system is highly targeted, unified and clear in helping us to understand God's Word.

In the meantime, we encourage the congregation to implement the one-year Bible reading plan. In the last cycle, 2 sisters completed their plan. We initiated the new cycle for the Bible reading plan in July. We pray that our brothers and sisters will have the strong confidence and perseverance to complete the one-year Bible reading plan as a way to entrench their root of belief and spiritual growth.

We have also provided training sessions for fresh believers and those who want to be baptised. Missionary workers from Overseas Campus have also initiated the "10 Day Bible Tour Guide" instruction sessions for adults after the Sunday service.

Sunday Worship

Thanks be to God that many brothers and sisters have been active participants in singing worship and encouraging their children to be the pianists. At the moment we have 4 established singing worship groups with committed brothers and sisters.

Children's Sunday School

Praised the Lord for the mission in Children's Sunday School. The children are divided into different groups according to their ages. We now have 5 classes compared with the previous 3 with over 70 children. At the beginning of this year, a youth group with children over 11 years old was established. We have invited a Sunday school teacher from the English Congregation to lead this group. We have also established the infant group with babies between 0 and 3 years old. Thanks to God's guidance, many parents have joined the services at Sunday school. Missionary workers from Overseas Campus who are also experienced Sunday school teachers have also helped us with teacher training. From April this year onwards, children and adults have joined the Sunday service together for the singing and the offering sections. We have also prepared a short time for children's teaching at our Sunday Service. Although we had different views in this issue in the very beginning, yet as we realise the importance of making children part of the service, the majority of the congregation now understands and supports

us. Thank God for letting the children be exposed to God's Word and instruction and know the significance of offering.

Evangelical Missions

A 12-people missionary team from the Enfu Congregation Hong Kong came to us in October to assist our evangelical mission training. Their rich experiences in missionary training yielded fruitful results. Thank God that our brothers and sisters cherished this rare opportunity to use the whole-day training to better equip themselves. They also went on to the streets to share the gospel with passers-by. Many brothers and sisters who were doing this job for the first time have been enlightened and encouraged by their training. We are also committed to the Lake District Gospel Holiday, English Corner, Welcome Fellowship for New Students, Bolton Student Fellowship among other ways to bring the gospel to people from all walks of life. We continue to envision that God's salvation plan will be fulfilled by bringing Chinese students and scholars to Britain and letting them get exposure to gospel. In April and October, two baptisms were held at MCCC Mandarin Congregation with 20 people being baptised. Thanks be to God.

Fellowship

At the moment, we at MCCC Mandarin Congregation have 9 family groups and fellowships: Fujian Fellowship, 2 Bible Study Groups in Sale, Worsley Bible Study Group, 2 Family Groups in Altrincham, Burnage Family Group, Brunswick Bible Study Group and Salford Bible Study Group. At the moment, missionary workers from Overseas Campus are helping us with the evangelical mission among students and scholars and the instruction of Bible Study. Many of our brothers and sisters have benefited tremendously from them. We are very much moved by their humble and kind service among us as they have given up their comfortable life back home to come to us. They have also visited the families in need. They are of great help to family relations and children's education. Over the past year, more and more brothers and sisters have been committed to spearhead the Bible Study. Everyone in these groups are willing to learn more about God's Word and apply what has been learnt in practice. In so doing, our brothers and sisters have felt God's guidance and blessing and the cohesion among group members has been further deepened. We help each other through prayer.

Pastoral Care

The Lord continues to bless the ministry of pastoral care in MCCC Mandarin Congregation. Besides our regular home visits, we have also extended our concern of caring to the juvenile in some families. Most of these young children have extremely difficult relationship with their parents. They tend to exclude themselves from the outside world and some of them even need to see a psychotherapist. Seeing the need of this group we truly need to pray for them, may our Lord give them wisdom, mercy and spiritual healing. What we have learnt from practice is that building relationship in trust among each other is of paramount importance. Therefore, it is essential to bring these young children to contact with the outside world and expose them to an atmosphere of caring, understanding, encouragement and vitality. However, we need the commitment of experienced missionary workers. So let God guide and instruct us in this cause.

Vision of Development

While we continue to be grateful to the faithfulness of our Lord, we have to face the fact that our brothers and sisters are highly mobile. When the Lord calls his chosen people, we often see leaving brothers and sisters same time. As the missions of MCCC Mandarin service further progress, we are always understaffed. The challenge of being shorthanded in evangelism may make us lose opportunities. As it is truly difficult to find a competent pastor, we now begin to adjust our request to God and pray that the Lord will bring his chosen ones to us according to His will. We do not choose our worker by their personal experience and competence but by their submissiveness to God and love for neighbours.

We will continue to develop our evangelical mission among students and scholars, instruct and cultivate the Fujian community and those working in restaurants, further improve the instruction and management of Sunday School as well as encourage the congregation in Bible reading and prayer as we work together with God.

- Since we are not moving to Cable Street in the next coming weeks, the Admin department has agreed to refurbish our Whalley Range church. Hope that our members can appreciate it and will look after our place of worship.

Before moving on to the next year budget, allow me to share with you this 'testimony'.

A few months ago an Asian Christian had approached MCCC and asked for our help. He and his wife are both struggling financially and are not getting any support from anywhere. At that time our annual budget had already been set and there isn't any spare money that can be set aside for this emergency. But reading their story I felt touched and I prayed for them.

The financial support was a sum of £1200. I decided to give the go ahead and I was pleased that the Council had supported me on the decision. What came next was unexpected.

A few days later a letter came through from Manchester City Council. The letter said that we will reduce your wastewater charge with immediate effect. This less amount is close to £1200. God has yet again shown me his gracious. He works in mysterious ways. Most importantly God has sent a clear message to us all - Have Faith in Him.

Therefore I tell you, *"whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours"*. (Mark 11:24-25)

ACCOUNTING

1. POLICIES 賬目報告政策

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) Accounting for Smaller Charities, issued in March 2005 and applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Charities Act 1993.

a) Basis of accounting 賬目報告原則
